Lille Lycée Thérèse d'Avila

Thérèse d'Avila school is located in northern France, close to Belgium and England. The gothic style building registered the first students in 1919. The center of the town is just 10 minutes' walking distance from the school.

- ▶ **School grades:** 10 to 12 (Lycée)
- ▶ **Number of students:** 690 students
- ▶ **Percentage of international students:** 1,2%
- ▶ **Baccalauréat success rate:** 100%
- ▶ **French as a foreign language course:** Not offered at school. The local coordinator can give students information on where to take a French course for an extra fee.
- ▶ **Duration:** academic year (from September), semester (from September or January)
- ▶ **School uniform:** No
- ▶ **Religion classes:** Catholic (optional)
