East Sussex College is a large college in the south-east of England. The college offers tailored educational programs across its 3 vibrant campuses in Eastbourne, Hastings, and Lewes. The college provides an enriching learning environment for students to reach their potential. The Lewes campus is situated in the heart of Lewes town.
